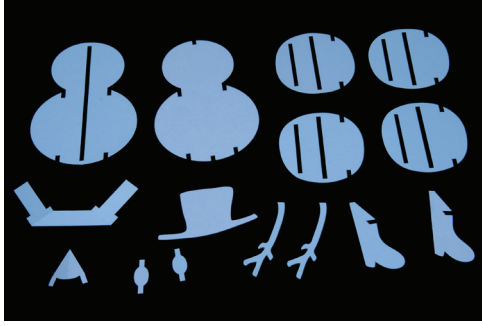
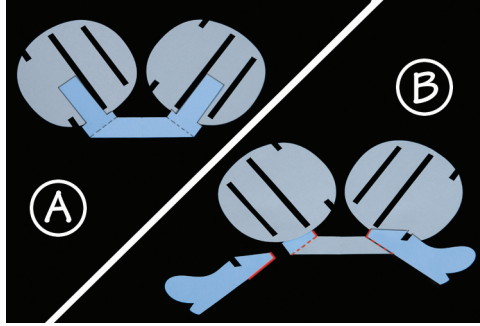


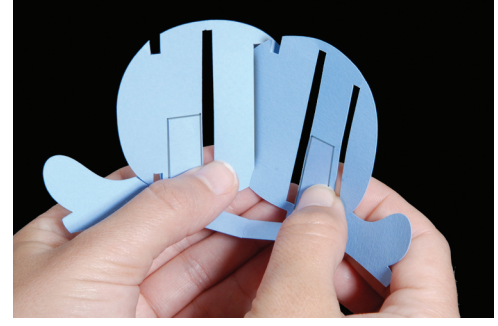
# Instructions



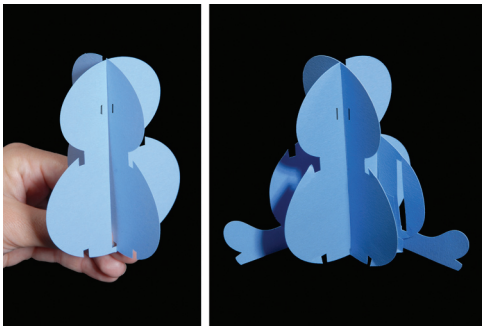
1. Die-cut die pieces as shown.



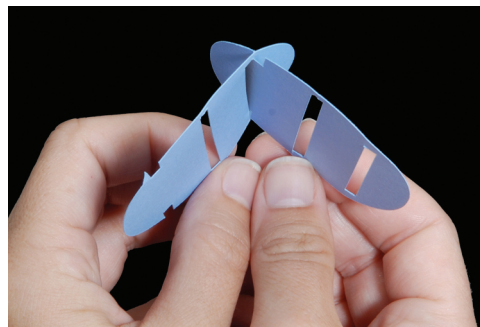
2. Orient two of the circles with the notches on the left. Attach the base piece (A). With the base attached, flip the circles over and attach the boots. Back of boot should line up with the perforated line on the base (B).



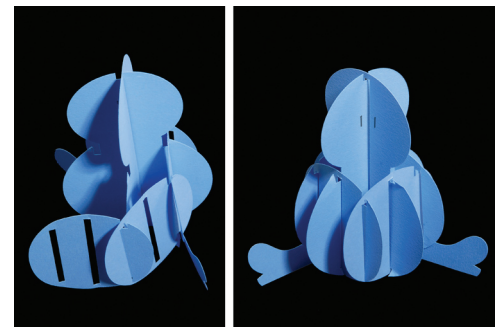
3. With the boots on the outside, create the back of the Snowman by connecting the two circles. Insert the tabbed end of the circle on the right into the shortest slot of the circle on the left.



4. Create the center of the Snowman by inserting the solid center piece into the slotted center piece. With the nose slots facing forward, attach the center of the Snowman to the back of the Snowman by inserting the notched ends into the two longest slots of the back piece.



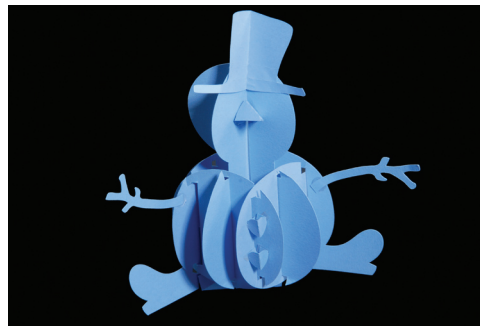
5. Using the two remaining circles, insert the notched end of one circle into the small slot of the other circle.



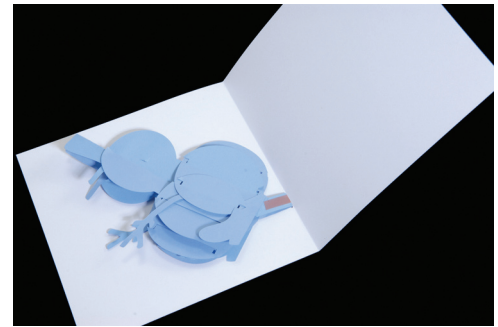
6. Attach the front piece to the center piece by inserting the notched end of the front into the open slot on the right side of the back. The remaining slots will align with the center piece of the Snowman. Pull the notched pieces through the two tallest slots. The final slot is for the left side of the back piece and will complete the body.



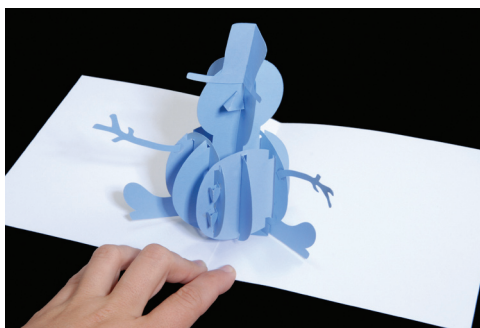
7. Attach the nose by inserting the two small tabs through the slots in the head. Tape the tabs to the back side of the head to secure them firmly.



8. There are no slots for the hat, arms or the buttons. Place the Snowman flat on its back. Align the center fold of the hat with the center of the head and adhere. To attach the buttons, place adhesive on the tabs and fold them back. Align the center folds. Place adhesive on the end of the arms and arrange as desired.



9. Attach the Snowman by aligning the folded base piece with the center of the card as shown.



10. With your own embellishments, this body could easily become a bunny, a chick, a pair of pumpkins ... be creative!
